## The Creed

### The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father.

Through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures;

he ascended into heaven

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified.

He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

### The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

in thought, and word, and deed,  
and in what we have left undone.  
For the sake of your Son our Lord Jesus Christ,  
forgive us all our offences;  
and grant that we may serve you in newness of life,  
to the glory of your Name. Amen.

*Celebrant* Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. Amen.

### **The Peace**

*Please stand.*

*Celebrant* The peace of the Lord be always with you.

*All* And also with you.

*Celebrant* Let us greet one another in the name of the Lord.

### **The Eucharist**

*Please stand.*

*Celebrant* The Lord be with you.

*All* And also with you.

*Celebrant* Lift up your hearts.

*All* We lift them to the Lord.

*Celebrant* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*All* It is right to give him thanks and praise.

*The Celebrant proceeds:*

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. For you are the source of light and life, you made us in your image, and called us to new life in Jesus Christ our Lord.

Therefore, we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

*All*            Holy, holy, holy Lord,  
                  God of power and might  
                  heaven and earth are full of your glory.  
                  Hosanna in the highest.  
                  Blessed is he who comes  
                  in the name of the Lord.  
                  Hosanna in the highest.

*Please stand or kneel while the Celebrant continues:*

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

*All*            Christ has died.  
                  Christ is risen.  
                  Christ will come again.

*The Celebrant continues:*

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honour and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. Amen.

And now, as our Saviour Christ has taught us, we are bold to pray:

*All*            Our Father, who art in heaven,  
                  hallowed be thy Name,  
                  thy kingdom come,  
                  thy will be done,  
                  on earth as it is in heaven.  
                  Give us this day our daily bread.  
                  And forgive us our debts  
                  as we forgive our debtors.  
                  And lead us not into temptation,  
                  but deliver us from evil.  
                  For thine is the kingdom,  
                  and the power, and the glory,  
                  for ever and ever. Amen.

*Celebrant*    The Gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

*All baptised Christians who profess Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour are welcome to receive Holy Communion with us. If you do not wish to take Communion, you may receive a blessing; please come forward and cross your hands across your chest.*

*Celebrant* Let us pray.

*All* Eternal God, heavenly Father,  
you have graciously accepted us as living  
members of your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ,  
and you have fed us with spiritual food in the

into the world in peace, and grant us strength and  
courage to love and serve you  
with gladness and singleness of heart;  
through Christ our Lord. Amen.

## Alternate Liturgy for Communion

## Brief History of the Cathedral of The Good Shepherd

Since 1846, the church, which is now known as the Anglican Episcopal Cathedral of The Good Shepherd, has been an important part of the English-speaking community in Lima.

The church was originally known as the Anglo-American Protestant Church or the Anglo-American Church. The first services were held at the home of the British Consul, General William Pitt Adams, moving in 1886 to Calle Pacae, which is now Jirón Carabaya, just off the Plaza San Martín downtown. There was also a church in Callao, where services were held for a fairly large congregation until WWII. The chaplain served both churches, most likely travelling by carriage until the tram lines were laid down in 1904.

The current church building was built in 1947 and consecrated in 1949, serving a multi-national community. Although The Good Shepherd was initially established to serve the English-speaking expatriate and non-Roman Catholic community, today its broader mission includes a Spanish-speaking congregation and it also serves as the cathedral of the Anglican Diocese of Peru, which includes churches in Lima, Arequipa, Cabanoconde, Juliaca, and Jauja.
